GENERAL RULES

The show grounds open at 6:00 am. If you wish to get a "good" spot or require more room to maneuver feel free to come in before the crowds. All cars (other than show staff) should be parked along the fence line or up on top of the hill.

1. All exhibitors shall be responsible for a thorough knowledge of and compliance with the rules contained in this book. Situations not specifically covered by these rules shall be handled by the show officials in a manner that most closely follows the spirit of these rules.
2. To be eligible for year-end awards, both owner and exhibitor of the equine must be a member of The Silver Heels Riding Club, Inc. before entering the first class of the show in which points are to be earned.
3. Exhibitors in all classes shall be neatly attired in clothing and with equipment appropriate to the class in which they are exhibiting. Refer to the appointment sections for more detail.
4. Presentation of a signed entry form shall be deemed acceptance of these rules and in the event of failure to sign the entry, the first entry into the show ring shall be deemed acceptance of said rules.
5. Exhibitors shall be responsible for any errors on entry forms.
6. The show management reserves the right to decline any entry or to return the entry before or during the show without being liable for compensation. The appointed judge for the day and/or show management has the right to excuse any horse for any reason including lameness issues or poor body score condition (4 and under)
7. The show management is required to inspect the registration certificate or a copy thereof of each horse entered in registered breed classes before issuing exhibitors numbers.
8. Equine age shall be determined by registration papers or veterinarian's certificate of age for any class requiring proof of equine age. Any exhibitor showing an equine under one year of age in a breed class (Morgan, Appaloosa, Quarter Horse, Arabian) must show proof of eligibility for registration.
9. For competition purposes, any equine is considered to be one year old on the first day of January following the actual date of foaling.
10. Proof of a negative Coggins test number will be required from all exhibitors in compliance with the state requirements for the state where the show is being held.
11. Lessee shall be considered as bona fide owner of the equine for the purpose of competition for the duration of the show year upon receipt by the Club Secretary of a written version of the lease.
12. Ponies are under 14.2 hands. Horses are 14.2 hands and up with the exception of registered equines.

13. The ring steward may not officiate in any class where a member of his/her immediate family, one of his/her riding students or a horse under his/her ownership is exhibiting. The ring steward must stay a reasonable distance from the Judge and must not in any way attempt to influence the judging. He/She should take great care to avoid influencing or to give the appearance of influencing the Judge in his duties. Questions directed to him/her by the Judge should be answered with great tact where the answer might sway the Judge's decision.

14. After the ring steward announces to the Judge, "This is your class," and/or the gate is closed, no other horse may then enter the ring and be judged.

15. Classes may be added and/or scratched up to three classes before the class to be added/scratched. You must complete an add/scratch ticket at the show booth before entering the ring.

16. If an exhibitor or his representative wishes to speak with the Judge, he must do so with permission and in the presence of the ring steward. Exhibitors may not speak with the Judge pertaining to their performances until they have completed their last class of the day; but they may view the Judge's cards for their previous classes with the Judge's permission.

17. Open class shall mean that exhibitors of all ages and seats are eligible to compete.

18. Exhibitors shall be allowed a three-minute tack change if necessary. The show secretary must be notified of all tack changes in advance.

19. No unauthorized person shall be allowed in the show arena during times of judging, performance or preparation for same except in emergency.

20. For purposes of showing, a junior exhibitor's age as of January 1st shall be considered as his/her age for the show season. A junior exhibitor is an exhibitor under eighteen years of age as defined above.

21. A rider is NOT allowed to ride / exhibit more than one horse in any class, except for trail or ranch pattern. A rider is NOT allowed to ride / exhibit the same horse more than once in any class.

22. Any indebtedness to The Silver Heels Riding Club, Inc. whether by bad check or nonpayment shall result in the irrevocable forfeiture of all points for the show in question. Such person and/or any equine in his ownership shall be barred from further participation in Silver Heels Riding Club competitions until and unless the debt, including any related fees, has been settled with cash, a bank check or money order. In addition, any future participation at Silver Heels Riding Club events for the remainder of the show season must be paid for in cash. Any

exhibitor stopping payment on a check to Silver Heels Riding Club will lose their membership and/or will be barred from any future Silver Heels Riding Club event(s).

23. Stallions must be housed on a trailer if left unattended on the show grounds. Stallions shall not be shown by nor be in the personal care of junior exhibitors.

24. Show management requires that all dogs in and around the show grounds be restricted, at all times, on a leash to be held firmly in hand or firmly attached to truck or trailer. The Show Committee reserves the right to remove from the show grounds and/or prohibit from future competitions any dog deemed to be a nuisance. No dogs are allowed in the Show Office or in the area adjacent to the Show Office.

25. No gait faster than a brisk walk is permitted in the immediate area around the show ring and food booth.

26. Exhibitors/spectators are not permitted on the show grounds in bare feet.

27. Any equine that tends to kick shall wear a red ribbon in its tail.

28. There shall be no smoking, drugs or alcohol in any form allowed or used on the premises.

29. The Judge's decision is final.

30. Walk / Trot: Open to riders who have never shown in a class that requires the canter / lope at any show. A show being defined as any event that you exhibit or have exhibited at, rated or unrated. W/T exhibitors may NOT cross enter in any class requiring a canter.

Exceptions to this rule will be considered if the exhibitor has a medical condition, illness or injury or any other valid reason that prevents them from safely cantering. In order to be considered for an exception, the exhibitor must put in writing their request to the board. Your request must include the details of why you feel the board should allow you to return to the Walk / Trot division. If approved, that exhibitor may be allowed to return to Walk / Trot and must adhere to SHRC's walk / trot rules at all other shows / events they show at. Any Walk/Trot rider found to have cantered at any other show / event, will forfeit the Walk/Trot points that they have accrued at Silver Heels for the year. They will be eligible to accrue points in the appropriate WTC classes for the remaining season.

Word of Mouth will not constitute proof of this. The accuser must provide the irrefutable proof including the rider's name and class description.

31. Walk/ Trot / Canter exhibitors are not allowed to cross-enter in any walk / trot classes unless they are showing a limited horse in the Limited Horse WT Class according to the Limited Horse Rules.

32. Any competitor who has taken lessons or had a horse in training with the judge appointed for the day must have ceased business no less than thirty (30) days prior to the show date.

33. Back numbers will be assigned at the first show you exhibit in for the current show season. This number will follow you all season. Please keep your back numbers. We do not have extra number sets. If you lose your number or it gets destroyed, you will need to create a new one.

34. Pre-entries do not have to be paid for at the time of submission. However, a form of payment must be submitted at check-in. All show bills must then be settled before leaving the show grounds. An additional \$10 fee will incur for show bills not closed out by the end of the show day.

SPORTSMANSHIP AND CONDUCT

1. Cruelty to or the abuse of an equine by any person at a Silver Heels Riding Club show is forbidden. The Judge and/or show management has the authority to dismiss from the class or show any exhibitor for cruelty to or abuse of an equine. Further disciplinary action will be referred to the Board of Directors.

2. Any un-sportsman like conduct by an owner and/or exhibitor shall jeopardize their right to further exhibit in the show. At any time, the Judge and/or show committee may issue a first warning to any exhibitor and/or owner for un-sportsman like conduct. Upon failure to comply with this warning, the exhibitor and/or owner will be disqualified from further classes in the show without return of any fees paid. These rules will be strictly enforced.

3. No points or awards will be given to any exhibitor and/or owner disqualified from a show for un-sportsman like conduct.

4. Open disrespect for the Judge and/or show management will result in disqualification.

REQUIRED APPOINTMENTS AND ATTIRE

Hunter Seat Appointment

Personal Appointments:

Conservative hunt coats, jodhpurs or breeches in traditional shades, high English boots or jodhpur shoes. Dark blue, brown or black hunt cap or black or brown derby is mandatory.

All youth exhibitors shall be required to wear protective headgear whenever mounted on the Silver Heels show grounds. Helmets passing or surpassing ASTM/SEI standards are recommended. Stock tie or choker is required. Hair must be neat and contained (as in a net or braid). Judges must penalize exhibitors who do not conform.

Tack Appointments:

English-style bit (snaffle, pelham, kimberwick and/or full bridle) with cavesson nosebands and plain leather browbands. All bits shall conform to the specifications of the AHSA and/or AQHA rule books. Saddles to be of the hunt or forward seat type with or without knee rolls. No cutback saddles.

Optional Appointments:

Unrowelled spurs, crops, bats, gloves, English breastplate and braiding of mane and tail in hunt style are all optional.

Prohibited Appointments:

Boots of any description on the equine, leg wrappings, rowelled spurs, draw reins, flash nosebands, figure eight nosebands, dropped nosebands and any type of martingales (in classes not required to jump).

Saddle Seat Appointment

Personal Appointments:

Coats of conservative color (white jacket in season) with matching jodhpurs, derby or soft hat and jodhpur boots. **All youth exhibitors shall be required to wear protective headgear whenever mounted on the Silver Heels show grounds. Helmets passing or surpassing ASTM/SEI standards are recommended.** Judges must penalize exhibitors who do not conform.

Tack Appointments:

Entries shall be shown in full bridles (curb and snaffle) or pelham bit and flat English-style saddles. All bits shall conform to the specifications of the AHSA rule book.

Optional Appointments:

Unrowelled spurs, gloves, whips or crops are optional.

Prohibited Appointments:

Forward seat saddles, martingales or similar tie-downs, draw reins, boots or chains on the legs of the equine.

While we are not offering academy classes at Silver Heels Riding Club, we do understand the need for an exception to the attire so academy students don't lose their academy status at other shows. Therefore, we will be making an exception to the attire requirements for Academy Students ONLY. Limited to riders enrolled in a lesson program who have not shown in regular performance classes, and who will be showing lesson horses.

Academy Attire will be allowed with the following requirements:

Jodhpurs, breeches, dark pants, Long sleeve collared shirt, Tie, Vest, Gloves, Jodhpur shoes. Derby hat or protective headgear. **All youth exhibitors shall be required to wear protective headgear whenever mounted on the Silver Heels show grounds. Helmets passing or surpassing ASTM/SEI standards are recommended.**

In addition, the following appointments will be allowed for Academy Students ONLY: Running martingale will be allowed with the use of a snaffle bit. NO Tie Downs or German Martingales allowed. NO Curbs bits allowed with a running martingale.

All other Saddle Seat Exhibitors: If you show in performance classes, you must show in performance attire and appointments as outlined above.

Western/Ranch Appointment

Personal Appointments:

Western boots, Western hat and long-sleeved shirt. **All youth exhibitors shall be required to wear protective headgear whenever mounted on the Silver Heels show grounds. Helmets passing or surpassing ASTM/SEI standards are recommended** Hair must be neat and contained (as in a net or braid). Judges must penalize exhibitors who do not conform.

Tack Appointments:

Western stock saddle that must be clean, in good repair, and properly fitted to both horse and rider. Silver not to count over a good working outfit. Romals or split reins may be used; but if romals are used, hobbles must be carried. Any standard Western bit shall be acceptable. In Western classes, a snaffle bit refers to a smooth snaffle bit with a broken mouthpiece (conventional O-ring, egg-butt or D-ring) and the ring no larger than 4 inch. One inch from the cheek must be a minimum of three-eighths inch diameter with a gradual decrease to the center of the snaffle. Snaffle bits may be used on horses up until the age of six. All bits shall conform to the specifications of the AHSA and/or AQHA rule books. Optional loose curb strap (leather or nylon only). Reins to be attached above the curb strap. A western curb bit shall have a solid or broken mouthpiece; have shanks and act with a curb action. Two-handed reining, snaffle bits and bosals will be permitted only on horses five years and under. Curb chains must be at least one-half inch wide and lie flat against the jaws of the horse.

Optional Appointments:

Gloves, spurs and chaps are optional. In Equitation classes, wearing of chaps shall be at the Judge's discretion.

Prohibited Appointments:

Tapaderas, mechanical hackamores, cavesson-type nosebands, martingales and tiedowns except where otherwise stated in specific class rules. Bosals prohibited except on horses five years and under.

EQUITATION TESTS

1. Drop stirrups in the line-up only.
2. Back.
3. Pick up reins (address reins).
4. Perform a figure eight at the trot/jog (with change of diagonals for English riders).
5. Perform a serpentine at the trot/jog or canter/lope with the type of lead changes desired to be specified by the Judge.
6. Drop stirrups and pick up or ride without stirrups.
7. Mount and dismount.
8. Perform a figure eight at the canter/lope with simple or flying lead changes as specified by the Judge.
9. Perform one or more changes of lead down the center of the ring.

RANCH HORSE PATTERN

To be selected by the Judge.

SHOWMANSHIP FAULTS

Faults against the exhibitor shall be as follows:

1. Failure to recognize and correct faults in the horse's position.
2. Losing contact with lead shank, 2 hands on shank or holding the chain.
3. Conversing with other exhibitors during the judging.
4. Standing directly in front of or on the wrong side of your horse.
5. Touching horse with hand or foot.
6. Kicking or placing horse's feet in position.
7. Failure of horse to lead properly.
8. Failure to stop before turning when showing at walk or trot.
9. Failure to back.
10. Break of gait or not performing the specific gait.
11. Loud voice commands to your horse.
12. Over-showing through unnecessary actions.
13. Blocking the Judge's view of the horse.
14. Exhibitor is not in the required position during inspection.
15. Turning the horse in the wrong direction.
16. Causing the Judge to move to avoid being bumped or stepped on by the horse.
17. Improperly fitted equipment.

Disqualifications:

1. Loss of control of your horse or horse becomes separated from exhibitor
2. A Fall
3. Willful Abuse

An Off Pattern includes: knocking over or wrong side of cone or marker.

DISQUALIFICATIONS

1. Use of prohibited appointments is cause for disqualification. Prohibited appointments include but shall not be limited to mechanical hackamores, hackamore bits, running or standing martingales (except in hunter/jumper classes over fences), tie downs, choke ropes, draw reins, bosals (except on equines five years and under), cavesson-type nosebands in Western classes and tapaderas.
2. A dropped noseband is prohibited in all English flat classes. A dropped noseband is interpreted as a cavesson and/or noseband, which is fastened below the bit (Flash and figure eight nosebands are considered this type of noseband).
3. Any artificial appliance shall be prohibited in all classes. An artificial appliance shall be defined as wired ears, nerved/nicked tails, the use of chains or rattlers on the legs and any medication, including ginger.
4. Lack of required appointments in any class or division specifying appointments will be cause for disqualification.
5. If either the equine or rider becomes injured or ill and cannot continue the class after the entry has entered the arena, the entry will be disqualified.
6. Riders not dressed in appropriate attire according to the rules of a particular class or division will be disqualified. Refer to appointment section.
7. Entrants shall be disqualified for failing to follow the Judge's instructions.
8. The Judge and/or show management shall have the authority to dismiss any entry from the arena if the entry is not under sufficient control.
9. A fall shall be considered a disqualification. A rider is considered to have fallen when he is separated from his/her equine in such a way as to necessitate remounting or vaulting into the saddle. An equine is considered to have fallen when shoulder and haunch on the same side touch the ground or the obstacle and the ground.
10. All exhibitors' numbers must be clearly visible when they enter the ring and at all times when in competition. Any exhibitor entering the ring without a number or an incorrect number will automatically be disqualified regardless of Judge's decision.
11. A Judge and/or show committee person may order any person or equine from competition for bad conduct of one or both or may disqualify any exhibitor for abuse of the equine.
12. Any exhibitor who is assisted by an unauthorized person inside the show ring or arena will be disqualified.

SHOW FEES

Members: \$13 per class Non-Members: \$15 per class
Office fee: \$10 per horse / rider Post Entry Fee: \$15 per horse / rider
Ring Radar fee (show software): \$5 per horse / rider
Truck-in Fee: \$25 a day for each non-showing horse with proof of negative coggins
Penalty Fees: \$10 fee will incur for show bills not closed out by the end of the show day
Returned checks will incur all fees we are charged by the bank as well as a requirement for all future bills to be paid in cash.
Entries must be received by 8pm the Wednesday prior to the show to avoid post entry fee.

ENTRIES

Entries can be submitted in one of the following ways:

- 1) **Online:** www.ringradar.com First create an account and then search for Silver Heels Riding Club. (PREFERRED METHOD)
- 2) **Email:** scan & email printable paper entry form to shrcentries@yahoo.com
Deadline for emailed: entries MUST be received by 8pm the Wednesday prior to the show.
- 3) **In Person:** the day of show - post entry fees apply

Entries MUST be received by 8pm the WEDNESDAY prior to avoid Post Entry Fees.

Pre-entries are HIGHLY encouraged. There is no penalty if you pre-enter and then scratch.

Please bring copies of required paperwork (coggins & registration) with you to the show for inspection. Or upload them to Ring Radar with your online entries.

Pre-entries do not have to be paid at the time of submission. However, a form of payment must be submitted at check-in (cash, check or credit card). All show bills must then be settled before leaving the show grounds. An additional \$10 fee will incur for show bills not closed out by the end of the show day.

MEMBERSHIPS

Membership benefits include lower class fees and eligibility to earn points towards year-end awards!

FAMILY (adult, spouse & their minor children under the age of 18).....	\$40

The prices listed above are subject to change annually.

You MUST be a member before entering the first class of the show in which points are to be earned. Points are not retroactive.

You may join and pay for memberships the day of the show and receive membership rates and earn points for that show and future shows in the current show season. Membership is NOT retroactive and points earned before becoming a member will not count towards year-end awards.

POINT SCORING

Points will be scored as follows:

First Place.....	8 Points	Fourth Place.....	5 Points
Second Place.....	7 Points	Fifth Place.....	4 Points
Third Place.....	6 Points	Sixth Place.....	3 Points

First - Sixth place will be awarded in each class at each show.

Champion, Reserve Champion and Third place will be awarded in each class for year-end awards.

For points to accrue for Day-End and Year-End Divisions, a team (horse and rider combo) must show in 3 out of the 4 qualifying classes within that division. For Divisions with only 2 qualifying classes, a team (horse and rider combo) must show in both qualifying classes.

For points to accrue for Year-End Awards, a team (horse and rider combo) must show in a particular class at least three times during a show season and must compete in 3 out of the 4 shows in a season.

In the case of a tie for Day-End and Year-End Division Championships, the tie will be broken by equitation points when applicable. The Driving Division will be broken by the Pleasure Driving class. The Ranch Division will be broken by the Ranch Pattern Class.

Any and all points will be forfeited by persons or equines disqualified or otherwise barred from competition.

Exhibitors and/or owners who are indebted to The Silver Heels Riding Club, Inc., have been found to have provided false information on entry forms or who have been eliminated from competition for poor sportsmanship or abuse of an equine will forfeit all points for the classes and/or shows involved.

For purposes of point scoring, lessee shall be considered as bona fide owner as per General Rule #11.

DAY-END DIVISIONS:

Driving, Leadline, EWD Leadline, WT English 12 & Under, WT English 13 & Over, WTC English 17 & Under, WTC English 18 & Over, WT Saddle Seat 10 & Under, WT Saddle Seat 11 & Over, WTC Saddle Seat, WT Western 12 & Under, WT Western 13 & Over, WTL Western 17 & Under, WTL Western 18 & Over, WT Ranch and WTL Ranch.

YEAR-END DIVISIONS / AWARDS:

(ELIGIBILITY BASED ON SHRC MEMBERSHIP RULES)

Driving, Leadline, EWD Leadline, WT English 12 & Under, WT English 13 & Over, WTC English 17 & Under, WTC English 18 & Over, WT Saddle Seat 10 & Under, WT Saddle Seat 11 & Over, WTC Saddle Seat, WT Western 12 & Under, WT Western 13 & Over, WTL Western 17 & Under, WTL Western 18 & Over, WT Ranch and WTL Ranch.

High Point Quarter Horse, High Point Pinto / Paint Horse, High Point Appaloosa, High Point Saddlebred / Arabian / Half Arabian / Morgan, High Point Open Pony, High Point Open Horse and High Point Ranch Horse. (Exhibitors MUST show in the appropriate halter class to qualify)

High Point Adult, High Point Youth 12 & Under, High Point Youth 13 - 17, High Point Member, High Point Showmanship, High Point Barn / Team (Hanson Cup), High Point Horse (Super Horse).

High Point NEPHC / SHRC Member, High Point Granite State Appaloosa / SHRC Member, High Point NHQHA / SHRC Member

SUPER HORSE (HIGH POINT HORSE) QUALIFICATIONS:

All classes, with the exception of: EQUITATION CLASSES, will count towards Super Horse. Any rider may ride the horse for the points to count. There must be three horses in the class in order for the points to count. EACH Horse / Rider combo MUST enroll for points to count toward the horse. Enrollment form can be found on our website at www.silverheelsridingclub.com under show day links.

THE BATTLE FOR THE HANSON CUP:

This is a TEAM / BARN Challenge. Much like the Stanley Cup, Super Bowl Ring or World Series Commissioner's Trophy, it takes a TEAM to earn this great accomplishment.

Don't show with a barn? No worries, just get together 4 or more of your friends to form a Team.

1. Each rider must be a current season SHRC Member.
2. Each Team or Barn must have a minimum of 4 horse / rider combos competing for one of the qualifying divisions. The more horse / rider combos in your Team, the better your odds are at the end of the season.
3. Qualifying Divisions: English Walk/Trot 12 and under, English Walk/Trot 13 and over, Youth Activities English, Adult English, Western Walk/Trot 12 and under, Western Walk/Trot 13 and over, Youth Western, Adult Western, Ranch Walk/Trot, Ranch Walk/Trot/Lope.
4. Pointed classes for each division are:
 - English / Western: Showmanship, Pleasure, Equitation, and Trail.
 - Ranch: Ranch Halter, Ranch Pleasure, Ranch Pattern and Ranch Trail
5. Each horse / rider combo must show in 3 shows for points to count.
6. Teams can be any number of horse / rider combos but only the top 4 horse / rider combo points will count towards the battle at the end of the season.
7. Fill out the Battle for the Hanson Cup Entry Form which includes your Team / Barn Name and all of your Team's horse / rider combo names.
8. Once the season has begun, there will be no additions or substitutions of horse / rider combos and no changing divisions. If a horse / rider combo cannot finish the show, another horse / rider combo **cannot** take their place. We highly suggest that you have more than 4 horse / rider combos participate in case one cannot finish for whatever reason.
9. In the event of a tie, the team / barn with the horse / rider combo with the most points will win. (For example, Team A and B are tied. Team A's highest member / horse rider combo has 15 points. Team B's highest member / horse rider combo has 17 points. Team B wins the battle) If still tied, a coin toss will be done at the Year-End Awards Banquet.

DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS

ADULT DIVISION - All exhibitors in this division shall be eighteen years of age and over.

APPALOOSA DIVISION - Equines shown in this division shall be registered with the Appaloosa Horse Club, Inc. or the Appaloosa Horse Club of Canada and must be entered under their full registered name and number.

ARABIAN/HALF-ARABIAN DIVISION – Horses shown in this division to be registered with the International Arabian Horse Association or the Arabian Horse Registry of America, Inc. and must be entered under their full registered name and number.

COLT AND FILLIES IN HAND DIVISION- Open to all colts and fillies 2 years of age and under as of January 1st. Horses need not be registered but proof of age will be required. Horses may not be ridden under saddle at any show.

COLOR BREED DIVISION - Open to horses with color patterns consistent with that of Palominos, Buckskins, Appaloosas, Paints and Pintos. Registration is NOT required.

DRIVING DIVISION – Open to horses and ponies. To be shown to a two or four-wheeled vehicle suitable for pleasure driving. Martingales permitted.

HALTER CLASSES-Open to Horses of any age.

IN HAND TRAIL- Open to minis and horses 2 years of age and under. Horses may NOT be ridden on the show grounds.

LEADLINE DIVISION - Riders in this division shall be eight years of age and under, Horses or ponies may be used. Appointments shall be as specified for the seat being ridden with the exception that protective headgear shall be required whenever mounted and no rider shall be discriminated against for the use of hard hat or helmet. Lariats prohibited for Stock Seat riders. Saddle should be properly fitted to both the horse/pony and rider. No exhibitor shall be tied, buckled or fastened in the saddle in any manner. Feet must be placed in properly fitted stirrups. A lead shank at least six feet long shall be attached to the shank of the bit or to a halter that is under the bridle so that while the rider is on the rail, the horse/pony is controlled by the handler. EQUESTRIANS WITH DISABILITIES LEADLINE DIVISION – Riders in this division shall be of any age, Horses or ponies may be used. Appointments shall be as specified for the seat being ridden with the exception that protective headgear shall be required whenever mounted and no rider shall be discriminated against for the use of hard hat or helmet. Lariats prohibited for Stock Seat riders. Saddle should be properly fitted to both the horse/pony and rider. EWD Exhibitors are permitted to be tied, buckled or fastened in the saddle in any manner. Feet must be

placed in properly fitted stirrups. A lead shank at least six feet long shall be attached to the shank of the bit or to a halter that is under the bridle so that while the rider is on the rail, the horse/pony is controlled by the handler. Handlers must be at least 14 years of age or older. Fall of horse or pony and/or rider shall result in disqualification. All leadline riders shall be led while mounted on the show grounds.

MORGAN DIVISION - Horses shown in this division must be registered with the American Morgan equine Association, Inc. or, if under one year, be eligible for registration and must be entered under their full registered name.

OPEN HORSE DIVISION – Open to all horses ineligible for any other breed class at this show. All horses must be over 14.2 hands. May be shown English or Western with appointments in accordance with the seat being shown.

OPEN PONY DIVISION – Ponies shall be ponies for the entire show season in all classes entered. All ponies must be under 14.2 hands. May be shown English or Western with appointments in accordance with the seat being shown. Not open to registered Miniature horses.

PINTO-PAINT DIVISION – Horses and ponies in this division may be of overo or tobiano pattern and need not be registered. Solid Bred Paint horses are eligible for this division with proof of American Paint Horse Association registration. Eligibility of unregistered entries for this division shall be at the discretion of the show management.

QUARTER HORSE DIVISION - All horses shown in this division shall be registered with the American Quarter Horse Association. Shall be shown under full registered name and number.

RANCH HORSE DIVISION (SHRC) - Horses in this division must be three years of age or older. Must be shown with the appropriate tack and attire. Silver is discouraged on the saddle and bridle. Open to riders of any age.

Description : All entries in this class shall be asked to travel over or through obstacles reasonably encountered on the trail. May be asked to canter/lope. Equine shall be allowed to enter both English and Western classes at any one show; but one equine may not enter a particular trail class more than once, regardless of change of rider. The gait between obstacles shall be at the discretion of the show committee. Entries shall be judged on performance over obstacles, manners and attitude.
